What does a CCMA do?

Medical assistants complete administrative and clinical tasks in hospitals, doctor offices, and other healthcare facilities.

Duties:

- Record patient history and personal information
- Measure vital signs, such as blood pressure
- Help physicians with patient examinations
- Give patients injections or medications as directed by physicians and as permitted by state law
- Schedule patient appointments
- Prepare blood samples for laboratory tests
- Enter patient information into medical records

What is their work environment like?

Most medical assistants work in doctors' offices, hospitals, outpatient clinics, and other healthcare facilities.

How do you become a CCMA?

CCMAs typically enter the occupation with a certification from a phlebotomy program. Almost all employers look for CCMAs who have earned this professional certification.
